# Order for Liturgy of the Word

Fifth Sunday of Lent

Entrance Antiphon: Give me justice, O God,

and plead my cause against a nation that is faithless.

Greeting: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen Sisters and Brothers, God invites us to hear his Word. Let us bless him for his goodness. Blessed be God forever.

Response: Blessed be God forever.

Introduction: We gather to day to celebrate the Lord's Day. One with our sisters and brothers and with the entire Church, we will listen to God's Word and join in prayer.

As we prepare to hear of God's love in Christ, let us acknowledge that the Lord is the source of pardon and strength.

Lord Jesus, you came to reconcile us to one another and to the Father, Lord, have mercy.

Response: Lord, have mercy.

Lord Jesus, you heal the wounds of sin and division: Christ, have mercy.

Response: Christ, have mercy.

Lord Jesus, you intercede for us with your Father, Lord, have mercy.

Response: Lord, have mercy.

Opening Prayer: By your help, we beseech you, Lord, our God, may we walk eagerly in that same charity with which, out of love for the world, your Son handed himself over to death. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

#### Profession of Faith:

# Prayers of the Faithful

For all of us who, at this time are deprived of the Eucharist but finding him in the Scriptures; in unity of faith, sustain our hope; we pray to the Lord.

Response: Lord, hear our prayer.

With trust in the mercy of God, we pray for all who have died.

Response: Lord, hear our prayer.

Prayer: Lord, you always hear the cry of your people, stand close now to all of us in these anxious times and awaken in the hearts of all: kindness, concern and compassion. This we prayer through Christ our Lord. Amen.

# The Lord's Prayer:

## Let us pray with confidence to the Father in the words our Savior gave us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; they kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

In the love of Christ, let us offer one a anther a sign of peace.

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

### **Benedictus**

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel; he has come to his people and set them free. He has raised up for us a mighty savior, born of the house of his servant David. Through his holy prophets he promised of old that he would save us from our enemies, from the hands of all who hate us. He promised to show mercy to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant. This was the oath he swore to our father, Abraham: to set us free from the hands of our enemies, free to worship him without fear, holy and righteous in his sight all the days of our life. "You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way, to give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins". In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, Amen.
