

# Preparation

- Parents should be registered members of St. John Vianney Catholic Church for 6 months and active participants in the Catholic Faith.
- There are two required preparation classes which must be attended by <u>both parents</u>.
- Upon successful completion of both classes, parents may schedule the baptism celebration.
- The baptism of children from infancy to six years of age is generally celebrated on Sunday afternoons. There are no "private" baptisms.
- Baptismal classes are offered in both English and Spanish.
- The nursery is available for those registered in baptism classes (ages 6 months - 5 years)

"The person baptized is incorporated into the Church and made sharer in the priesthood of Christ." ~CCC 127



## **Godparents**

- One or two persons may be chosen as godparents for Baptism (if two are chosen one must be male and the other female)
- Godparents must be 16 years of age and a fully initiated, actively practicing Catholic (celebrated Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist). If married, God parents must be married in the Catholic Church
- Godparents are encouraged to attend baptism preparation classes at St. John Vianney or their own parish. A certificate of completion or a letter of good standing must be presented.
- A non-Catholic Christian may serve as a Christian Witness along with a Catholic who will be a Godparent.
- An unbaptized person cannot serve as a Godparent or a Christian Witness

## The Ceremony

- The Rite of Baptism is regularly celebrated in the Ars Chapel unless otherwise noted.
- Parents and Godparents should arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the beginning of the liturgy.
- Infants must wear white for the liturgy
- The parish provides the baptismal candle, and no other items need to be purchased.
- Parents and Godparents are expected to dress appropriately.
- Photos and/or videos of the ceremony may be taken from the pews. Family and friends should not leave the pew. Time for photos will be allotted after the baptismal celebration has concluded.
- Religious articles can be blessed following the ceremony.
